

Food Pantry News



During January 2018 we served the following numbers of people in the food pantry:

We distributed <u>51,002 lbs. of food</u> during the month and we <u>spent \$2,850.66</u> on food. Our average cost per pound of food was eight cents. <u>We are now receiving food deliveries/pickups each day of the week. All of this food has to be carried into the food pantry, weighed, and stored properly. In <u>addition, many of the boxes are full of mixed product that must be sorted before we can put it on the shelf.</u> If you can help, please contact Tom Culverwell.</u>

Thank you for the donations of paper and plastic bags. We continue to have to purchase paper and plastic bags. Your donations of paper and plastic bags will help us by lessening the number of bags we will have to purchase.

We appreciate any food donations, but we can stretch a dollar a lot farther than you can by buying food from a supermarket. By partnering with Feeding Northeast Florida Food Bank and Waste Not Want Not, we are able to get approximately \$12.00 worth of food for every \$1.00 donated.

In addition to your financial support, a total of <u>931 man-hours were donated to the food pantry in January.</u> Each volunteer hour has a value of \$18.85 on each volunteer hour performed, so <u>the 931 volunteer hours donated in 2018 is equal to a donation of \$17,549.35.</u>

Since every pound of food received has to be carried into the food pantry, the receipt of food is a very labor intensive activity. If you can help in any way, it would be greatly appreciated. Even if it is only sorting out boxes of food, your participation would be greatly appreciated. Monday: retail pickup and bread pickup. Also the first and third Monday of each month we receive our USDA food, once again a very labor intensive event. Wednesdays and every other Friday we receive a "route end" delivery from Feeding Northeast Florida. The truck seldom arrives before 11 a.m. and much help is needed on these days as well. Lastly, on Thursdays we receive another retail pickup. If you can help on any of these days, it would be greatly apprecieated. In addition, we began doing a retail pickup from the new Walmart at Collins Rd. & I-295 each Monday and Friday. WE REALLY NEED MORE HELP WITH SORTING AND STORING ALL THE FOOD RECEIVED. This work can be done sitting down. Please consider helping out with this if you can spare only a couple of hours per week.

This is God's ministry and He wants it to be successful. You are all God's angels for making this happen. God bless you all. This would not be possible without your support and our Lord taking care of His food pantry. Except for a few hiccups, we were able to provide each household that came to the Trinity Food Pantry a nourishing bag(s) of food to help them through their tough times.

Thank you and God bless all who helped the food pantry.

Remembering Billy Graham


I wish I could remember the year. I want to say it was 1960, but that would only be a guess on my part. Mother drove us all the way to Soldiers Field from our home in northwest Chicago to attend the Billy Graham Crusade. I remember not really wanting to go, but a word of warning from my grandma about how sorry I would be for missing such a fine man just seemed to settle it in my mind. No, I wouldn't dare miss my one chance to see and hear Billy Graham! Grandma was right. His part of the evening didn't come until very near the end. That was all right with Grandma. She loved hearing George Beverly Shea sing. I don't recall a lot of Rev. Graham's message, but the parts that I will never forget were the plain simple truths of the Gospel which he had such a wonderful way to make clear and understandable. "Who knows," he would say, "but that this may end up having been your last chance to come and accept the Lord's invitation?" I know those were not his exact words, but the implication was that we would be foolish to risk our eternal life by not making a public show of faith that Jesus was our Lord. And before anyone could come up with any excuses, Rev. Graham would add, "If you came with a group or in a bus or van, they'll wait for you." And they did! The parking lots were full of vehicles long after the crusade had eneded. One of them was my very own mother's car!

Rev. Graham has largely been retired for quite some time now, yet, I am a little surprised at how I personally feel his loss. I will be praying for his famiy, and thanking God for his ministry.


