"I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing." (John 15:5)

This verse is one of seven "I am" statements from John's gospel. It is jammed packed with imagery, meaning, and inspiration for our lives today as believers

and followers of the risen Christ. Take a look at the statements Jesus makes in this verse about our relationship with God through him:

- 1) We are connected to Jesus, who is our source of life, like branches of a vine;
- 2) We are to "abide," that is to "remain, stay, live, dwell, last, endure, and continue," with Jesus Christ in our lives in relationship with him (just as Jesus abides with us);
- 3) We are to bear much fruit, that is our lives and work are to reflect and pass on the love that God has for the world. We are a witness to the good news of Jesus Christ's redeeming and bringing new life to the world through his death and resurrection in love toward one another;
- 4) We cannot do this or live apart from Christ, just as a branch cut off from the vine dies.

Wow! I could preach a sermon on each one of these images! I and we at Trinity have also come through a jammed packed spring filled with the many ministries that happen through and going on at Trinity being at full-speed, from the Food Pantry, to CEW, to the Honduras mission trip, the Via de Cristo weekend, and others. We have been blessed and renewed in faith through the worship season of Lent, Holy Week, and the Easter Resurrection celebration. And we have begun to look toward the future for Trinity with the DreamLeaders Initiative and in the discussion and vote to enter into a capital campaign to raise a significant sum of money to support proposed projects of roof replacement/ repairs and building restoration that are needed now.

As God would have us to proceed in the life and ministry of Trinity, we are reminded by Jesus to remain connected to him as he is our life-blood through the Holy Spirit that comes to us. We can only produce the fruit of God in this world and in life by staying connected to Jesus Christ in prayer, study, worship, and service through the living word of Jesus Christ, the root of our being and source of life. **Apart from Jesus we can do nothing!**

May the Holy Spirit, the life of Jesus Christ for us and the world, bless and strengthen you in life, love, and service to one another and in the world.

Food Pantry News



During March 2018 we served the following numbers of people in the food pantry:

We distributed 40,360 lbs. of food during the month and we spent \$603.36 on food. Our average cost per pound of food was just over one cent. So far in 2018 we have served 6,504 households, consisting of 11,962 people. Also, we have distributed 127,828 pounds of food at a cost of \$4,517.10, an average of just over three cents per pound. We are now receiving food deliveries/pickups each day of the week. All of this food has to be carried into the food pantry, weighed, and stored properly. In addition, many of the boxes are full of mixed product that must be sorted before we can put it on the shelf. If you can help, please contact Tom Culverwell.

Thank you for the donations of paper and plastic bags. We continue to have to purchase paper and plastic bags. Your donations of paper and plastic bags will help us by lessening the number of bags we will have to purchase.

We appreciate any food donations, but we can stretch a dollar a lot farther than you can by buying food from a supermarket. By partnering with Feeding Northeast Florida Food Bank and Waste Not Want Not, we are able to get approximately \$28.00 worth of food for every \$1.00 donated.

In addition to your financial support, a total of 1,122 man-hours were donated to the food pantry in March. Each volunteer hour has a value of \$18.85 on each volunteer hour performed, so the 2,856 volunteer hours donated in 2018 is equal to a donation of \$53,835.60.

WE REALLY NEED MORE HELP WITH SORTING AND STORING ALL THE FOOD RECEIVED. This work can be done sitting down. Please consider helping out with this if you can spare only a couple of hours per week. Since every pound of food received has to be carried into the food pantry, the receipt of food is a very labor intensive activity. If you can help in any way, it would be greatly appreciated. Even if it is only sorting out boxes of food, your participation would be greatly appreciated. Monday: retail pickup and bread pickup. Also the first and third Monday of each month we receive our USDA food, once again a very labor intensive event. Wednesdays and every other Friday we receive a "route end" delivery from Feeding Northeast Florida. The truck seldom arrives before 11 a.m. and much help is needed on these days as well. If you can help on any of these days, it would be greatly apprecieated. In addition, we began doing a retail pickup from the new Walmart at Collins Rd. & I-295 each Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday.

God continues to provide everything needed to run his food pantry, but we could use more manpower help. Because of the layout of the food pantry we cannot just move a pallet of food from the parking lot into the pantry. Each box or case must be hand carried inside and then sorted out and stored. We do use hand trucks, but it is still very labor intensive. Please look into your heart and if you can spare only a few hours per week, we can use your help.

Three Little Words



- 7. WORD


