WHY ARE WE DOING A CAPITAL CAMPAIGN?

God has blessed Trinity Lutheran Church with a calling to serve the community and to proclaim Jesus Christ to the world. For more than 90 years, ministry in and through this stately building has helped people locally and globally. The enduring foundation of Trinity is its people-faithful saints from the past, and now us--building on that foundation for today and into the future. United by God's grace, we are fearlessly committed to serving our community and sharing God's love with everyone. This is our vision for ministry; in this time, in this place.

However, we have reached a point where our facility needs renovation and renewal before serious structural issues become a barrier to our pursuit of this vision. The condition and life of the roof systems, stone and masonry work, and sanctuary electrical systems are beyond regular maintenance. Our Building is sustaining water damage that has and will lead to structure deterioration and eventual compromise.

Following diligent exploration of all issues, our congregation has developed a renewal and renovation plan to address these issues, with an estimated total project cost of \$925,000. This plan also includes upgrading and refurbishing spaces within to make our facility more attractive, inviting and usable for all who gather here--members, visitors, neighbors.

The building plan is a large and ambitious project that is important to our ministry vision. The purpose of this campaign is to commit financial resources that will get the project started, so that our facility will continue as a foundation for all who call Trinity home. But also as a tool that helps our ministry grow. We have been called by God to mission in this place, we are strong, we are here to stay.

REMEMBER: Both our 2019 Stewardship Commitments and Capital Campaign commitments will be pledged and received on Commitment Sunday.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

Even if we raise \$400K, how do we fund a \$925K project?

There are several options we will explore together as a congregation. We could use bequest funds such as the remainder of the Kripps bequest, we could sell property, we could borrow money or we could do some of all of the above.

If we don't raise \$400K, do we still proceed with the renovations?

This house of worship has been entrusted to our care by generations past. It is now our turn to ensure that future generations have the same benefit. Your congregation council is committed to restoring and preserving our house of worship for future generations. Our capital campaign "From This Foundation" is the foundation upon which we hope to build a complete renovation project. We are confident that the congregation will support these efforts and that yes, we will proceed with the repairs and renovations but ultimately, that decision will belong to the congregation.

Are we going to use money from the Permanent Endowment Fund or the Kripps bequest?

The Kripps bequest funds were given with no restrictions and could have been used to support the general operating budget but the council wisely decided to set those funds aside for a special purpose to be determined later. Later may be now. Regarding the Permanent Endowment Fund, there are no plans to use any PE fund money for the repairs and renovations.

Will we sell property?

Ultimately, the decision to sell property can only be made by the congregation.

Food Pantry News



During September 2018 we served the following numbers of people in the food pantry:

MONTH PERSONS HOUSEHOLDS

SEPTEMBER 4,104 1,125

We distributed 37,451 lbs of food during the month, and we spent \$1,699.20 on food. Our average cost per pound of food was 5 cents. So far in 2018 we have served 20,240 households, consisting of 37,324 people. Also, so far in 2018 we have distributed 359,317 pounds of food, at a cost of \$17,796.41, an average of 5 cents per pound.

We are now receiving food deliveries/pickups every day of the week. All of this food has to be carried into the food pantry, weighed, and stored properly. In addition, many of the boxes are full of mixed product that must be sorted before we can put it on the shelf.

Some folks have stepped up to make the required runs to pick up food each week, but these same people are also working in the food pantry two or three days a week. It would be nice if some others could step up and relieve these very busy people of this requirement. Please pray about this and ask yourself if you can spare a couple of hours each week to support this important ministry of Trinity Lutheran Church and Avondale United Methodist Church.

Thank you for the donations of paper and plastic bags. We continue to have to purchase paper & plastic bags. Your donations of paper and plastic bags will help us by lessening the number of bags we will have to purchase. The store from which we have been purchasing the paper bags no longer carries the bags we need, so I have been forced to look at other providers. The bags are available but at a much larger price.

We appreciate any food donations, but we can stretch a dollar a lot farther than you can by buying food from a supermarket. By partnering with Feeding Northeast Florida Food Bank, and Waste Not Want Not, we are able to get approximately \$20.00 worth of food for every \$1.00 donated. The donations to the food pantry have fallen off of late, and we are having a difficult time paying for the amount of food we need. We need around \$1,500 each month to pay for the food we receive from Feeding Northeast Florida. If you can help, please do.

In addition to your financial support a total of <u>903 man-hours were donated to the food pantry in September</u>. <u>Each volunteer hour has a value of \$24.14</u> for each volunteer hour performed; so <u>the 8,322 volunteer hours donated so far in 2018 is equal to a donation of \$200,893.08!</u>

God continues to provide everything needed to run his food pantry, but we need more funding and manpower help. Because of the layout of the food pantry we cannot just move a pallet of food from the parking lot into the pantry. Each box or case must be hand carried inside and then sorted out and stored. We do use hand trucks, but it is still very labor intensive, and most of the people doing the carrying are senior citizens! Please pray about this and if you can spare only a few hours per week, we can use your help.

Thank you and God bless all who help the food pantry in any way.


