"When Jesus saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd." (Matthew 9.36)

There's a lot of talk about "diversity" these days. There's talk about how divided people in our country are because of political, social, and even religious, differences. There is talk about how hard it is for us to understand and accept each other's differences.

Wherever Jesus went, huge crowds of people followed Him and gathered around Him. Mixed in among the crowds, there were all kinds of people. ## "FROM THIS FOUNDATION OUR MINISTRY GROWS" CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

(FTF-OMG)

#### **JULY UPDATE**

We have completed the first of six, six month periods of FTF-OMG, and as we reported last month, many facility improvements have been accomplished. The Hall of Memories was completely retrofitted with LED lighting as well as the rear walkway by the choir room and interior office corridor. Office lighting was upgraded using more energy efficient fluorescent lamps.

Likely the most visible changes have been to the chancel lighting. We have retrofitted and re-aimed all chancel spot lights with low energy, highly efficient very low heat producing LED lighting. The obvious benefit is aesthetic as many have commented on the newly discovered beauty of the Ascension Mural behind the altar. Less obvious is the substantial reduction in heat introduced to both the Chancel and the Hall of Memories by replacing incandescent lighting with LED lighting, a savings of over 5,000 watts (5KW).

What you don't see and what has NOW BEEN COMPLETED is the replacement of 100-year-old fusible electrical equipment in the Sanctuary and in the basement and the rewiring (where necessary) of certain branch circuits. The church council wisely decided that this project was to come before all others as a precaution against a disastrous fire. The decision was made prior to the great fire at Notre Dame which further validated why upgrading electrical systems is vital.

What's next? While a master plan is being developed, certain elements seem to be coming into place. Congregation approval will be sought soon but the plan looks like this:

As we move into the second six-month period of FTF-OMG, our next project would be to replace the sanctuary roof, gutters and flashing as well as tuck point and repair mortar joints in the brickwork and stone coping around the sanctuary building. This will be followed by cleaning and sealing all the masonry surfaces of the sanctuary building. This should stop all water intrusion into the sanctuary allowing us then to repair and repaint areas that have been damaged by water.

Likely, in the next six months, this same process will also be undertaken in all areas under a flat roof such as the music suite, offices, Cecil Pool Room and kitchen. This work will require extensive repairs to the masonry work in the colonnade as well as the removal of all rooftop A/C units and the stone coping around the colonnade. Depending on funding, interior repairs and improvements are also being considered.

Its also possible that we would address the roof and waterproofing issues in the Hall of Memories. Ideally, all of these projects should all be done together which would require alternate sources of funding such as selling property, borrowing money or both.

The FTF-OMG Capital campaign was a great success in that we raised over \$400,000 to be received over a three-year period but our needed repairs are estimated to be more than \$900,000. The council plans on coming to the congregation with more information and discussion prior to proceeding with any work beyond the electrical work we are presently undertaking.

## **Food Pantry News**

During May 2019 we served the following numbers of people in the food pantry:

MONTH # PERSONS # HOUSEHOLDS 3,334 929

We distributed <u>46,540 lbs. of food</u> in March, and we <u>spent \$1,324.50 on food</u>. Our average cost per pound of food was about 4 cents per pound. So far in 2019 we have served 6,731 households, consisting of 17,672 persons. We have distributed 198,048 pounds at a cost of \$8,121.26.

In an attempt to keep the Wednesday crew from being at the food pantry in excess of 8 hours we are considering changing the Wednesday hours 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. This would mean that the pantry will not be open on Wednesday mornings. If you have a desire to help out in the food pantry on Wednesday evenings please let Tom Culverwell know. I anticipate starting the Wednesday evening hours in August; if you are able to work from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday evenings please contact Tom Culverwell (FP2006@trinity4jax.org. Cell (904)254-0063.

The number of families we are serving monthly has decreased to below 1,000 households. I don't know the exact reason for this drop, but it may be tied to the fact that food stamps are now being distributed twice a month. This has leveled out our weeks in terms of numbers of households, and may also have had an effect on the number of households.

The Lord continues to give us everything we need to keep his food pantry operating, but we could use some more volunteer help.

## Music Notes

#### "What a Friend We Have in Jesus" by Joseph Scriven (9/10/19 - 10/10/86)

"What a Friend We Have in Jesus" was written by Joseph Scriven in 1855 apparently for the comfort of his sick mother in Dublin, Ireland. Though it may also be related to his second fiancee's death.

Born in Ireland, Joseph's father was a captain in the Royal Marines. Joseph went to Trinity College for two years and then in 1837 he attended Addiscombe Military College, Surrey. Prevented by his poor health from pursuing a military career, he completed his studies at Trinity College in 1842 with a BA. The day before his wedding, his fiancee drowned.

After moving to Canada in 1844 Joseph taught at Woodstock and Brantford, Ontario. He moved to Bewdley, near Rice Lake to be a tutor for the family of Lieutenant Pengelly. His second fiancee, a relative of the family he was tutoring, got sick and also suddenly died before they were married.

Joseph was a member of the Plymouth Brethren, and wrote a few hymns that were published in 1869 as "Hymns and Other Versus". Seeking to carry out literally what Jesus said in the Sermon on the Mount he gave away his property and did menial work for those who were handicapped and poor, being known as "the man who sawed wood for widows and sick people who are unable to pay". Unfortunately his poor health, lack of money, and worry that he would become a burden helped to fuel his on going depression.

It is unclear whether his drowning in Rice Lake was accidental or suicidal.
