

My "higher education" years were wonderful experiences for me. The five years at North Carolina in Chapel Hill were not only filled with the academic studies of business, accounting, history, and other courses, they were tremendous years of growth for me spiritually and in new relationships. I was truly in the southern part of heaven where the sky was always "Carolina Blue." The four years in seminary (including my internship year in Wisconsin) in preparation of the call to ordained ministry were just as tremendous as another new chapter in life. There were new relationships to be made, including the meeting of my life-long partner in Pastor Janis and again the growth spiritually and in training to be a parish pastor.

Yet, for all the enjoyment and wonderful experiences of these years, they came with their challenges, one of which was how to finance college and then later seminary. In both cases it took a lot of faith and piecing together financial resources. I was not quite smart enough or athletic to earn full scholarships. My parents were not wealthy and there was not a tremendous amount of savings. It took a combination of working and saving funds for college during the summer, parents' contributions, partial scholarships through financial aid, and student loans to pay for college. It took about seven years to pay-off the student loans, which was about the time of God's call for me to go to seminary. Again, to pay for seminary, took a combination of liquidating my savings and retirement account, working during the sessions, support from my congregation and the North Carolina Synod, and student loans. Pastor Janis and my first congregation was a small church in Prattville, Alabama where we shared the call, which meant both being full-time invested in the ministry at half of the recommended salary each. Needless to say those were some lean years financially, but like so many stories I hear from people reflecting back on their lives wondering how they made it, we did "make it" and continue going forward by the strength and grace of God.

Trinity as a congregation is now entering into a time to grow spiritually and in the challenge to restore its facilities. We have just taken a tremendous leap of faith to commit to the restoration of the facilities by securing a loan for up to the estimated full amount for the proposed projects of \$925,000. There will be some challenging years ahead, as there have been in the past, but we can and will "make it" through this chapter in the life of Trinity Lutheran Church as a worshiping community in service of Jesus Christ leaning on the strength and grace of God.

On Sunday, August 18th a congregational meeting was held following one worship service that day. A motion was presented from the Church Council to enter into a loan agreement with the Mission Investment Fund for a loan up to \$925,000.00 to provide working capital for the projects proposed in the "From This Foundation, Our Ministry Grows" campaign. After much discussion, the sharing of concerns, and the presentation of one possible scenario of a pay back of funds borrowed, the motion passed. Thank you to all who attended the meeting on August 18th.

Rusty White and Jerry Johnson along with Jodie Marchman (project consultant) are now working on confirming the choice of a roofing contractor and developing a project construction timeline. Through July 31st, \$149,554 has been received in contributions toward "From This Foundation, Our Ministry Grows".

Food Pantry News



During July 2019 we served the following numbers of people in the Food Pantry:

MONTH July <u>PERSONS</u> 3,794

HOUSEHOLDS 1,009

We distributed 41,619 lbs. of food in July, and we spent \$434.70 on food. Our average cost per pound of food was about 1 cent per pound. So far in 2019 we have served 10,547 households.

In an attempt to keep the Wednesday crew from being at the Food Pantry in excess of 8 hours we are considering changing the Wednesday serving hours to 5:30pm to 7:30pm. This would mean that the pantry will not be open on Wednesday mornings. If you have a desire to help out in the Food Pantry on Wednesday evenings, please let Tom Culverwell know. I anticipate starting the Wednesday evening hours in September; if you can work from 5:30pm to 7:30pm on Wednesday evenings, please contact Tom Culverwell <u>FP2006@trinity4jax.org</u>. Cell (904)254-0063. Ideally, I would like to recruit two teams to work the Food Pantry on Wednesdays; one from 10:00am to noon, and one from 5:30pm to 7:30pm. The route end crew would come in around noon and work until everything has been sorted out and stored.

The number of families we are serving monthly increased in July to more than 1,000 households. This is the first time in several months that we have exceeded 1,000 families. I don't know the exact reason for this increase, but it shows that there are still needy people to be served.

The Lord contines to give us everything we need to keep his Food Pantry operating, but we could use some more volunteer help, especially on Wednesdays.
