REFORMATION SUNDAY OCTOBER 27, 2019



"Cast your burdens upon the Lord and he will sustain you." (Psalm 55:22)

Back at the end of August, I had become very anxious about a number of things going on in life and in the life of the congregation. (The impending impact of Hurricane Dorian did not happen to be one of them.) This was a time when I was doing a lot of planning for the fall programs at Trinity, such as, the after-school CEW programs and the Discipleship Training program, among several other programs and upcoming events for the fall. But what really stopped me cold one day was an on-going project at home that had hit a major snag. That project involved something called a "backflow preventer" that was (and is) not cooperating with our irrigation system.

I had received a letter form JEA at the beginning of July, about having a backflow preventer attached to the irrigation system tested and certified. Well of course one has to have a backflow preventer in the first place to be tested. To make a long story over these past couple of months short, the backflow preventer installed is not working correctly with our home irrigation system. After having the installers, another company to take a look at it, and talking with an irrigation person, the problem still could not be solved.

Deflated and paralyzed, I did not know which way to turn. Finally one morning after not being able to sleep, I got up early and sat down in the dark letting my mind wrestle with my anxiety. Finally, I came to repeating the verse that we used to sing as part of the worship liturgy that I remembered from childhood, "Cast your burdens upon the Lord and he will sustain you." Then another song that I had been hearing on a contemporary Christian radio station came to my mind who's chorus goes:

"I will cast my cares on you. You're the anchor of my hope, the only one in control. I will cast my cares on you. I'll trade the troubles of this world for your peace inside my soul." (Finding Favour, 2015)

St. Anne is the hymntune, which this hymn is based on, by William Croft in 1720 or thereabout. Croft was born near Stratford-on-Avon in England around 1678. Later he became the organist at St. Anne's in Soho--the church that in 1685 was dedicated to the Virgin Mary with Princess Anne in mind, which gives its name to the tune.

Grand arrangements of this tune have been written by many composers the most famous of them being J. S. Bach. Bach's solo interpretation for organ solo is not for the faint of heart to facilitate. Food Pantry News



During August 2019 we served the following numbers of people in the food pantry:

We distributed 35,404 lbs. of food in March, and we spent \$361.08 on food. Our average cost per pound of food was about 1 cent per pound. So far in 2019 we have served 12,649 households, consisting of 28,891 persons. We have distributed 314,794 pounds at a cost of \$11,871.69.

In an attempt to keep the Wednesday crew from being at the food pantry in excess of 8 hours we are considering changing the Wednesday hours 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. This would mean that the pantry will not be open on Wednesday mornings. If you have a desire to help out in the food pantry on Wednesday evening please let Tom Culverwell know. I anticipate starting the Wednesday evening hours in September; if you can work from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday evenings please contact Tom Culverwell

FP2006@trinity4jax.org. Cell (904)254-0063. Ideally, I would like to recruit two teams to work the food pantry on Wednesdays; one from 10 a.m. to noon, and one from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. The route end crew would come in around noon and work until everything has been sorted out and stored.

The number of families we are serving monthly increased in July to more than 1,000 households. This is the first time in several months that we have exceeded 1,000 families. I don't know the exact reason for this increase, but it shows that there are still needy people to be served.

The Lord continues to give us everything we need to keep his food pantry operating, but we could use some more volunteer help, especially on Wednesdays.
