

"FROM THIS FOUNDATION OUR MINISTRY GROWS" CAPITAL CAMPAIGN (FTF-OMG)

After one year into the "From This Foundation, Our Ministry Grows" capital campaign, here is a summary of the campaign and of the work progress:

- Through October 31, 2019 \$167,887 has been given toward the \$400,745 pledged for the three year campaign;
- To date, \$29,733 has been expended for project costs: \$15,192 for Sanctuary re-wiring, \$13,242 for the campaign expense, \$449 for Sanctuary gutter removal, and \$850 for MIF loan fee;
- A roofing contractor (Register Roofing) has been selected to do the roof work, along with a stone and masonry contractor. A pre-construction meeting was held on October 30th to lay out the construction timeline. Work is to begin in early January 2020.

Thank you to all who have committed and contributed to the campaign and to Jerry Johnson and Rusty White who have dedicated their time and energy to making the construction projects happen.

Food Pantry News



During October 2019 we served the following numbers of people in the food pantry:

We distributed <u>28,834 lbs. of food</u> in October, and we <u>spent \$439.26 on food</u>. Our average cost per pound of food was about 4 cents per pound. So far in 2019 we have served 16,623 households, consisting of 36,376 persons. We have distributed 366,273 pounds at a cost of \$6,428.78.

We are asking once again that you save your egg cartons and bring them into the church when you can. We have begun receiving eggs again and need all the cartons we can get.

We continue to struggle with a small amount of financial donations each month. We have a balance at Feeding Northeast Florida to pay for the route end deliveries, but when that money is expended we have no more funds to send to FNEF, which means the route end deliveries will end. We are getting very little food from the retail pickups and the amount of USDA food we are receiving is very small.

The Lord continues to give us everything we need to keep his food pantry operating, but we could use some more volunteer help. We also need to pray for the Lord to give us a solution to our financial shortages.

Items Needed for Honduras

- *Acetaminophen (Tylenol); Extra Strength (500 mg) and PM
- *Aspirin (81 mg)
- *Naproxen (Aleve 220 mg)
- *Hydrocortisone, Benadryl cream
- *Ibuprofen (Advil, Motrin) (200 mg)
- *Bengay cream
- *Adult Vitamins; Vitamin A and E
- *Prenatal Vitamins
- *Lice Killing Shampoo (8 oz bottles)
- *Small and Travel size toothpaste
- *Girls' hair "pretties" (barettes, flowers, scrunchies, etc.)
- *Toothbrushes (children and adult)
- *Children's Chewable Vitamins (NOT Gummy!)
- *Medical exam gloves (especially small)
- *Omeprazole or Lansoprazole small)
